Fourth Sunday of Lent

Gospel | Jn 9:1-41

The man who was blind went off and washed himself and came back able to see.

Jesus and his disciples encounter a man who was born blind. The disciples ask Jesus if the man's blindness was the result of his own sin or the sin of his parents, but Jesus explains that the man's blindness is not the result of sin, but rather an opportunity for God's power to be displayed.

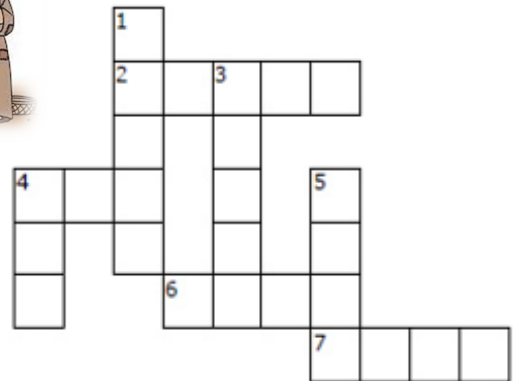
Jesus then spits on the ground, makes clay with the saliva, and spreads it over the man's eyes. He instructs the man to go and wash in the pool of Siloam, and when the man does so, he is able to see for the first time in his life.

The Lord acts in mysterious and often unexpected ways. We seldom have things happen how we might imagine or even hope they will, but fortunately God's plans are greater than ours! This lesson discusses how important it is to trust in Jesus for all things, even if we have a hard time understanding Him. His power and methods are beyond comprehension!
